REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY AT PENZANCE

WREATHS LAID AT WAR MEMORIAL.

The usual Remembrance Sunday service not being possible under existing circumstances, a short service was held at Penzance War Memorial on Sunday morning, conducted by the Vicar of St. Mary's (Rev. W. P. Gilpin).

A representative group of members of Penzance British Legion attended, accompanied by the Mayor (Alderman Robert Thomas, J.P., C.C.), Mr. Alec Beechman (M.P. for the St. Ives Division), and Mr. W. G. Goodfellow, C.A.

Rev. Gilpin recited Binyon's immortal lines in memory of those who laid down their lives for their country, and spoke appropriate prayers, after which the small company sang the National Anthem.

The British Legion wreath was laid by the chairman (Mr. W. J. Hichens), that of the Corporation by the Mayor, and that of Colonel Leslie (president of Penzance British Legion) (unavoidable absent), by Mr. Beechman.
